Uzbekistan

Uzbekistan is a Central Asian nation and former Soviet republic. It's known for its mosques, mausoleums and other sites linked to the Silk Road, the ancient trade route between China and the Mediterranean. Samarkand, a major city on the route, contains a landmark of Islamic architecture: the Registan, a plaza bordered by 3 ornate, mosaic-covered religious schools dating to the 15th and 17th centuries.

The rich history of Uzbekistan goes back thousands of years. According to the archaeologists, this is one of the oldest places of human life. It is known that the territory was inhabited long before our era, even in the early Paleolithic, as shown by the finds, which are represented by the dwellings found in the Baysun-Tau Mountains and the instruments – in Samarkand. Neanderthals lived here in the late Paleolithic. Their burial found in the Teshik-Tash grotto belongs to the Mousterian culture. Over the thousands of years, the great empires were formed and disintegrated on the territory of our country, which left an undeniable mark in the history and culture of Uzbekistan.



About Samarkand city

Samarkand is a beautiful city in Uzbekistan with iconic Islamic architecture. It is situated in the east-central region of the country. Samarkand was founded 2,750 years ago and it is one of the oldest cities in the Central Asian countries. Samarkand was known as Maracanda in the 4th century BCE. This ancient city was one of the highlights of the silk route. Samarkand unites different culture around Uzbekistan and other Central Asian countries. Samarkand is also a hub of different cuisines and an ideal city to taste authentic Uzbek dishes.

Registan Ensemble


Registan Ensemble was reconstructed multiple times over the years. Presently, it is surrounded by 3 madrasas, which are great sights to see when you are travelling. The 3 madrasas are Ulugbek, Shirdor and Tila Kari.

Bibi-Kharym Mosque

It is a restored mosque and it is named in memory of Timur's wife. Bibi-Kharyam Mosque is known for its majestic islamic architecture and it is one of the most beautiful building in Central Asia.

Ulugbek's Observatory

Observatory was named after Timur's grandson. It is situated in the north-east outskirts of the Samarkand city. It used to be decorated with glazed tiles, majolica, and mosaic until it was destroyed. The only part that is still preserved at the observatory is a section of a big sextant which is an astronomical instrument.



About Samarkand State Medical University

Founded in the year 1930, we are a 90 year-old medical university. Until the year 2022 it was known as Samarkand State Medical Institute. In 1997, the government introduced two programs; National Training Program and State program for healthcare reforms which gave birth to the Faculty of Higher Nursing. By the year 2005, the university had set up Faculty of Medical Pedagogy and then in the preceding years came Faculties of Dentistry, Medical Biology, and Pharmacy. The university has 74 departments with 1190 classrooms. There are all the necessary modern day teaching facilities available at the university.

Student Housing

There are 4 student dormitories available at Samarkand State Medical University. They are located in 37 Dahbet Street, 41 Dahbet Street and 31 Giyosiddin Jamshid Street. Each student house has the following facilities:-

- ◆ Each student house has a library with 3,000 books which are relevant for the students.
- ◆ There are refrigerators and gas stoves placed on every floor of the student houses.
- ◆ Fully furnished floors with Television set up on each of the floor.
- Washing machines are provided for laundry purposes.
- ◆ Student houses are installed with efficient heating system.
- ◆ Computer rooms with 24*7 Wi-Fi and internet access.
- ◆ There is a spirituality room in each of the student houses.
